THE 2023 ANNUAL DAHLIA SHOW.

July 2023 marked the 75th anniversary (the Diamond Jubilee) of the founding of The Greater Philadelphia Dahlia Society. The original resolution upon which The GPDS was founded stipulated that its purposes include: "the production of finer dahlias, the dissemination of dahlia information, and the stimulation of interest in, and appreciation of dahlias..." The resolution went on to propose an annual dahlia show, the first of which was held in 1948 in conjunction with the joint Chester County/Bryn Mawr/Devon Horse Show. The original GPDS Executive Committee and its general membership applied for a branch membership in the American Dahlia Society, which had already been in existence for 33 years. For perspective, the oldest dahlia society in the United States, the Snohomish County Dahlia Society in Washington state was founded in 1909, and our sister society the National Capital Dahlia Society was already twelve years old in 1948.

One member of the original GPDS Executive Committee stands out as being perhaps the most illustrious member in GPDS history: Stanley Johnson. In his honor, the most prestigious award presented by the American Dahlia Society bears his name: The Stanley Johnson Medal, awarded to the cultivar "with the greatest number of higher than blue ribbon awards that were won at shows held during the previous year by ADS member societies in the United States and Canada."

As we celebrate our Diamond Jubilee, GPDS has grown to include over 140 members, many of whom have joined during and since the COVID pandemic. We remain committed to upholding the same purposes stated above in our original resolution from 1948. We invite everyone who has an interest in dahlias to come to one of our meetings to see if we can further your interests and inspire you to become a dahlia enthusiast. For those of you who are already GPDS members, continue to volunteer your time and mentor others to enable GPDS to fulfill its stated objectives. Enjoy this year's show and consider how GPDS can help you achieve your dahlia dreams between now and next year's show!

Longwood Gardens is located on US Route 1, about three miles northeast of Kennett Square, Pennsylvania. It is easily accessible from I-95 or Route 926.

Information for Exhibitors, Judges and Members

All exhibitors, judges, and members must initially enter Longwood Gardens via the Business Entrance. The Business Entrance is located at 409 Conservatory Road, Kennett Square, PA. Turn left. Follow signs through the woods to get to the Music Room patio. Longwood students will assist with unloading your car.

At the entrance to the staging area on the Music Room patio, sign in at the Registration Table. If you do not have a name tag already, you can get one there. After unloading, continue to the lower level and park. If there are no parking spaces available there, you will have to put your car in the main entrance parking lot. Turn around, retrace your path to exit at the Business Entrance and drive to the Main Visitor Entrance. Use your name tag to re-enter Longwood Gardens via the Visitor Center. Before 10 am, enter the Visitor's Center at the Group Entrance off the terrace to the right of the main doors and around the corner.

Coffee and snacks will be served Saturday morning near the staging areas.

Note: There will be a few handicapped parking spaces near the staging area. Contact Wes Bowers (contact info below) before the show to arrange handicapped parking.

Rules of Exhibition

1. ALL EXHIBITORS must sign in at the registration table.
2. UNIFORM ENTRY TAGS must be used.
Tags can be obtained at the Show.
Tags must be completely filled in, top and bottom, with variety name, section, classification number, and exhibitor's name to qualify for an award.
3. NUMBER OF EXHIBITS. Any person may have any number of different varieties in any class, but no more than two may be of the same variety. Each exhibitor in Division II, Juniors, may have an unlimited number of entries.
4. BLOOMS shown in competition must be grown by exhibitors entering them, except in Division VI .
5. A SMALL GROWER grows plants for pleasure, does not sell for a profit, has never been employed as a gardener, and grows less than 75 plants.
6. CONTAINERS will be supplied by Show Committee, except in basket and Dilly Dahlia...ing divisions. (Some baskets and vases are available.)
7. CLASSIFICATION. All entries in the show will be judged in accordance with the current official American Dahlia Society classification as to size, form and color.
8. SUPPORTING STEM. The use of any material to support dahlia stems above the container will disqualify the exhibit.
9. ALL THREE BLOOM ENTRIES must be of same variety.
10. SETS OF LEAVES. All blooms should have at least ONE set of leaves.

11. PACHYSANDRA, CHRYSANTHEMUM, BOXWOOD, and FRAGRANT SWEET BOX may NOT be brought in to Longwood Gardens.
12. THE DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES ARE FINAL.
13. UNWORTHY ENTRIES. Judges will withhold award when they consider any entry unworthy.
14. TRI-COLOR will be awarded for each form where applicable and worthy.
15. BASKET SCORECARD: Baskets are judged on the quality of the blooms and of the arrangement.
 - a. Quality of blooms 50%
 - 1) Color 10%
 - 2) Form 10%
 - 3) Substance 5%
 - 4) Stem and foliage 5%
 - 5) Uniformity 20%
 - b. Quality of arrangement, proper balance 30%
 - c. Distinction—overall effect, including color harmony, artistic application of all the materials used in the entry 20%
16. REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS. No exhibit may be removed at any time during the show except by permission of the Show Committee.
17. ADDITIONAL RULES. The Show Committee reserves the right to make additional rules and classes, to change the schedule as becomes necessary, to remove from the table before or after judging any exhibit it considers to be in poor condition, or to make such further rules as it deems necessary for the proper conduct of the Show.
18. LIABILITY for loss or damage is disclaimed by The Greater Philadelphia Dahlia Society.

In memoriam

Brenton (Brent) R. Grant, Jr.

The Greater Philadelphia Dahlia Society is sorry to report the unexpected loss of longtime member Brent Grant. Brent was an avid grower and advocate of dahlias for more than 75 of his 90 years. His dahlia obsession started when he grew ONE tuber in 1946, before The Greater Philadelphia Dahlia Society even existed!

Brent joined The Greater Philadelphia Dahlia Society in 1992. He served The GPDS in many capacities and was always ready to do whatever was needed: member and chair of numerous committees, Vice President, President, editor of the newsletter “Dilly Dahlia...ing” (1994 to 2003), meeting and picnic host, enthusiastic cheerleader. He was persistent with encouraging members to participate in the society tuber sales, so much so that he pretty much single-handedly grew the annual tuber sale to two events in two locations, each with a dedicated following. He was co-chair of the ADS National Show in 2008; his career in engineering prepared him for the task of managing the myriad of logistics and people needed to host a spectacular show at Longwood Gardens. For the 2018 National Show, a seven-person committee was needed to do what Brent had done for the 2008 show; the bar was high! Brent was particularly fond of manning the Education Table at our annual shows and tuber sales, where he enjoyed teaching visitors all about dahlias, answering questions, passing out brochures, and encouraging all to give growing our favorite flower a try. If you wanted to find him, the Education Table was the first place to look for the man wearing the Dahlia Dude hat!

Brent was also active in the American Dahlia Society. He served as a representative for his home society, as well as on ADS committees. He took on the chairmanship of the Research Committee in 2013 and got directly involved with a dahlia fertilization study. He attended many dahlia society shows, ADS meetings, and National Shows where his graciousness, friendliness, and enthusiasm earned him countless friends.

Throughout his long adult life he was accompanied by his beloved “Margie,” an equally valuable GPDS member in her own right. We all share the family’s loss, but realize we are blessed to have fond memories of not only a consummate dahlia ambassador, but an exceptional husband, father, grandfather, and friend.
